A. SOUTH AFRICAN SPORTS COALITION: NATIONAL

1. INTRODUCTION: NATIONAL ORGANISATION.

The **South African Sports Coalition (SASCOL)** is **affiliated** to the **International Sports Coalition (ISC)** whose focus is to organize a **sports ministry during all major world sporting events** - like the Olympic Games (IOC), the Soccer World Cup (FIFA) etc.

2. MEMBERS: NATIONAL BOARD

The SASCOL Board is an **inter-church and inter-denominational organisation** whose 40 members **represent some 28 million South African Christian** denominations and organisations.

The **board members** are Chris Lodewyk (Chairman), Joe Tshwana (Vice-chairman), Clive Gepaul, Clive Jacobs, George Mahlobo, Carl Hendriks, Martin Castans, Moses Ntlha, Neville Goldman, Victor Pillay, Ivan Abrahams, Trevor Tucker, Timothy Tucker, Cassie Carstens, Mosa Sono and Xola Skosana. The two Chief Operation Officers are Joseph Jacobs and Nkosinathi Sixabayi.

3. SASCOL NATIONAL PROJECT: THE ULTIMATE GOAL (TUG)

SASCOL has organized a particular **project** around the 2010 World Cup tournament called **THE ULTIMATE GOAL**. The **vision** of the project is to **share the love and message of Jesus Christ** in many different ways with players, their families, coaches, officials and game organizers, visitors /fans and local residents. The **East Cape's slogan** is: **More than just a Game. Putting Jesus into 2010.**

4. SASCOL: NATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The SASCOL board has indicated **four main national objectives**.

4.1. UTILISING SPORT

The project aims to utilise the 2010 soccer tournament **to organise a sports ministry throughout South Africa**. In order to establish this goal the following programs are to be implemented.

4.1.1. Ubabalo eAfrica

Brings opportunities for the development of soccer, social and life skills to the African youth and aims to transform the younger generation through value-based whole life coaching.

4.1.2. Global Community Games

Kids Games, Teen Games, Family Games and Edge Games events will be organized within communities in order to draw agencies, churches, companies\ organisations and schools together. This **connects the creativity** of all **children, teenagers and families**, **builds bridges** in communities and **promotes life-skill values** – all centred around the soccer tournament.

4.1.3. Big Screen Events.

Big screen events enhance the enjoyment of the 2010 tournament and **bring** DVD presentations of **world-class soccer games** into the **rural areas**. **Life-skill values** can also be promoted before the screening of soccer events.

4.1.4. Soccer Clinics and Soccer Tournaments.

Trained soccer and life-skill coaches conduct soccer clinics and local tournaments. They **promote** the **game** and simultaneously teach sound **values**.

4.2. SOCIAL FOCUS

The project drives a **strong social awareness** by concentrating on the following:

4.2.1. Expansion of tournament awareness

This social program brings the tournament into (for example) orphanages and prisons. It **promotes enjoyment** and **new hope** in the lives of these suffering people and also **encourages charitable fundraising** and **micro-enterprises** to support these deprived communities.

4.2.2. Staging of Events

The hosting of Creative Arts, Multi-Cultural, Music and Entertainment Festivals in local communities **entertains** the **crowds** around a soccer motif. It also **promotes life-values** in schools, churches and organised events.

4.3. CHURCH INVOLVEMENT

The Churches in South Africa provide the **best existing networks** throughout the country and are also likely to have the greatest number of suitable **volunteers**. The aim is to involve all Christian churches in the following activities:

4.3.1. Production \ distribution of Christian Resources

This production includes booklets, videos, tracts, magazines, radio and TV broadcasts. The aim is to reach the masses with sound **life-skills and values**, using the **rules of soccer** as a **metaphor**.

4.3.2. Prayer Networks

The **mobilizing of prayer support** (before, during and after the tournament) for all involved in the 2010 soccer event, including soccer players, coaching staff, officials, Local Organising Committees, security and medical personnel and the thousands of spectators.

4.3.3. Street Evangelism

To promote life-skills, values and the 2010 tournament by staging puppet-shows, clowning, balloon-sculpting, face-painting and mascots in order to create **interaction** with the **youth** and the **crowds** at **local community gatherings**.

4.3.4. Sport-theme services

To hold church services around a sports theme and to **utilise** the **rules of soccer** and other activities to **promote Christian values** in correlation with the Ubabalo eAfrica guidelines. The aim is to impact the church of Christ to give new hope to South Africa and to develop transformational disciples through sport. **Christian soccer players** will also be invited to **testify** at these services.

4.3.5. Hosting Functions

To organise speaker\breakfast\dinner functions to **promote** the **tournament** and to **introduce Christian soccer players**. These players will testify about their Christian commitment and their value-orientated lifestyle.

4.3.6. Providing Volunteers

To **provide** and to **train volunteers** in official and unofficial capacity to serve as drivers, guides in towns and on sight-seeing tours, translators at hospitality centres and ushers at games. The **incorporation** and **mobilisation** of **international volunteers** from participating countries

will assure the definite implementation of extended experience in global sport events.

4.3.7. Setting up Hospitality\Visitor centres

To set up hospitality centres for receiving the thousands of visitors to an African country with its different landscape, climate and people is of critical **importance** for future **tourism extension**. It also provides the **opportunity** to extend a hand of **Christian hospitality** at entrance ports, cooling centres with free cold water, information kiosks with internet facilities and the provision of related information about important places to visit.

4.4. COMMUNICATION

The project tries to **minimise** the **negative issues** about the 2010 soccer tournament by **feeding positive information** into available communication channels.

4.4.1. Constant provision of information

To present current and **accurate information** to the local (and international) press about the activities, programmes and progress of the Ultimate Goal project while underlining the correlation with the 2010 soccer tournament. This function will **promote interest** and **excitement** amongst the general public and will also **underline** the **massive influence** of **soccer** in the **local community**.

4.4.2. Utilising of church networks

The communication networks of the various churches are well established and what is conveyed is generally believed to be accurate. The regular provision of accurate data for utilizing in local congregational announcements and publications will create a constant awareness about the 2010 happenings. Soccer rules will be used to teach value-based life-skills. These organized efforts will inspire interest and will increase soccer involvement within local communities.

5. SASCOL: NATIONAL DESIRED OUTCOMES.

SASCOL aims to establish the following positive outcomes with THE ULTIMATE GOAL project

5.1. NATION BUILDING

- 5.1.1 To positively **impact** the South African nation and other countries beyond its borders.
- 5.1.2. To **reconcile** divided people / groups and to build the South African nation
- 5.1.3. To **eradicate** Afro pessimism and create hope for its peoples.

5.1.4. To **instill** loyalty towards South Africa among its people.

5.2. LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

5.2.1. To **advance leadership** development in an organised manner.

5.2.2. To **promote value-based life-skills** through sports development.

5.2.3. To promote the acquisition and development human **skills and gifts**.

5.2.4. To attract, retain and positively **impact all the youth** of South Africa.

5.3. ADDRESSING OF SOCIAL DISORDERS

5.3.1. To **restore family life** in the community

5.3.2. To provide healthy **alternatives** to **social disorders**.

5.3.3. To help with the **alleviation** of **poverty**.

5.3.4. To create access to **skills through service**.

5.4. CHURCH INVOLVEMENT

5.4.1. To advance the **relevance** of the Church and the Gospel.

5.4.2. To create **opportunities** for the proclamation of the Gospel.

5.4.3. To **engage** the Church with society beyond the Church walls.

5.4.4. To **move** from a 'Reaching Church' to a 'Serving Church'.

5.4.5. To **guide** the Church to become more visible in the Public space.

5.4.6. To **make** the Church more accessible to the youth.

5.4.7. To **enhance** the credibility of the Church.

B. SOUTH AFRICAN SPORTS COALITION: EAST CAPE

The following **strategic guidelines** implement the SASCOL NATIONAL initiatives within the EAST CAPE REGION.

1. MAIN OBJECTIVES

1.1 PRESENTED OPPORTUNITIES

To utilise the presented opportunities around the 2010 soccer tournament to the **maximum benefit** of the **East Cape region** by:

1.1.1 promoting sound **values and leadership** development through life-skills coaching and training

1.1.2 building a **legacy for beyond 2010** on which churches, all schools and the local communities can build a values-driven lifestyle.

1.2 CRIME

To **fight** Crime by

- 1.2.1 utilising Ubabalo eAfrica and Global Community Games programmess to attract, retain and positively impact our youth through activities that provide a **healthy alternative to crime**
- 1.2.2 developing leadership through **life-skills and positive values**
- 1.2.3 **addressing** the **social ills** in our schools and communities by means of art, music and festival events
- 1.2.4. establishing **prayer networks** throughout the Eastern Cape to support the fight against crime.

1.3 HIV & AIDS

To help prevent HIV & Aids by

- 1.3.1 focusing on **Grade 7's** in all schools for the next 5 years
- 1.3.2 utilizing and **extending existing projects** and programmes in this regard.

1.4 FAMILY BREAKDOWN

To **act against** Family Breakdown by

- 1.4.1 leading **men to accept accountability** for their own actions and behaviour; and responsibility to be good husbands, fathers, mentors and members of their communities
- 1.4.2 encouraging families to get **involved** in ULTIMATE GOAL soccer and sport **programmes and projects.**

1.5 NATION-BUILDING

To promote **reconciliation, nation-building** and **hope** for the future by

- 1.5.1 establishing multicultural **prayer networks**
- 1.5.2 **local soccer** tournaments, events and other **activities.**

1.6 LEGACY

To build a **legacy** that will last beyond 2010

- 1.6.1 on which churches, schools and the community can build a positive **values-driven lifestyle.**
- 1.6.2 from which Africo pessimism can be countered and a **new hope** in the future can be built.

2. PLAN OF ACTION: CHURCHES

Each church is requested:

- 2.1 To accept the **challenge** of becoming a more outwardly that inwardly focused church.
- 2.2 To **implement** the given ULTIMATE GOAL strategy within the local congregation and community.
- 2.3 To **utilise** the existing fraternals, municipal cluster/ward system as the organisational unit of the local ULTIMATE GOAL project.
- 2.4 To **recruit** 3 persons:
 - 2.4.1 one person to **represent** their church on the local Ultimate Goal committee
 - 2.4.2 one as a sports-co-ordinator to **promote** Ubabalo eAfrica, Global Community Games and competitions (between boys' and girls' teams) within their own community.
 - 2.4.3 one to attend to the indicated **prayer** programmes.
- 2.5 To organise an interdenominational prayer network within the local congregation and/or community. This prayer network to **promote** the following prayer initiatives within the local community:
 - 2.5.1 **Pastors' prayer groups** across the racial divide in order to reach out to one another and to pray for The Ultimate Goal project as organised in the local community.
 - 2.5.2 A '**Mothers Who Care**' group at every school to pray regularly.
 - 2.5.3 Interdenominational **prayer opportunities** to pray for a specific local ULTIMATE GOAL programme.
 - 2.5.4 SAPS and SACS **prayer support groups** to strengthen the staff members and inmates at all local police stations and prisons, and so help to fight crime.
 - 2.5.5 '**Prayer walking**' at crime hot spots to help fight crime.
 - 2.5.6 A '**Youth Prayer Evangelism Programme**' in every school.
- 2.6 To indicate a voluntary **HUB Church** in each fraternal, municipal cluster and/or ward. This Hub Church must **accept responsibility** for the co-ordinating of all ongoing Ultimate Goal projects and programmes in their ward and/or fraternal.

Note: We encourage everybody involved to utilise existing structures and not to create new or to duplicate organisations.

3. PLAN OF ACTION: SCHOOLS

All local Ultimate Goal **committees** should:

- 3.1 Form **school zones** by grouping all local feeder and primary schools together around the nearest high school.
- 3.2 Indicate a **volunteer HUB school** in each municipal cluster and ward:
 - 3.2.1 to accept responsibility for the **co-ordinating** of all ongoing ULTIMATE GOAL projects and programmes in the applicable ward and/or fraternal.
 - 3.2.2 to **facilitate** ongoing value-orientated sports training and activities in each of their zones.
- 3.3 The long term goal is to supply each school with a **permanent life-skills coach**, sponsored by parents, a church or business in close proximity to the applicable school.

Note: All existing life skills coaches at the schools should be liaised with to ascertain co-operation and the adding of value to existing life skills orientation programmes.

4. PLAN OF ACTION: BUSINESS

The Regional and local committees should **inspire** all surrounding and local businesses:

- 4.1 to **join** SASCOL in its fight against crime
- 4.2 to **sponsor** a life skills coach at a school
- 4.3 to help **develop** a sports facility at a chosen school
- 4.4 to **support** the local ULTIMATE GOAL committee by financing their initiatives
- 4.5 to **encourage** their employees and their families to participate in the ULTIMATE GOAL programmes

5. PLAN OF ACTION: GOVERNMENT

- 5.1 Invite the local ward councilor and ward representatives to join your local committee i.e. sports, religious and community development worker and any other relevant government departments.
- 5.2 Liaise with office bearers of the Departments of Education; Social Development; Sports, Recreation, Arts and Culture; Health, Metro Religious Unit and SACC.

6 PLAN OF ACTION: JUNE-JULY 2010

The World Cup Soccer **Tournament** will be held from **11 June to 11 July 2010**. The ULTIMATE GOAL project aims to use the excitement and high interest during this time for the following:

6.1 June / July School Holidays 2010

To **utilise** this school holiday

- 6.1.1 to **organise** local inter- school, inter-community and inter-church soccer **tournaments**. The goal is to let everybody play soccer on the beaches, in the streets, backyards and parks.
- 6.1.2 to encourage local churches to host '**holiday clubs**' during this time. SASCOL: EC will supply names and contact numbers of persons with expertise and experience in organising such holiday clubs.
- 6.1.3 to use every opportunity to **bring the gospel** in the most appropriate way within the local community throughout the holiday.

6.2 Big screen events

- 6.2.1 To organise teams of **volunteers** to establish big screen events at the most suitable available venue within the own community
- 6.2.2 To **screen** an **evangelistic DVD** before the showing of a DVD of a world cup **soccer game** in the **local community**.

7. PLAN OF ACTION: TRAINING ACADEMIES

The training of life-skills coaches and volunteers is of the **utmost importance** for the success of the ULTIMATE GOAL project – anybody must be able to join the programme at any stage:

7.1 Establishment of Training Academies

Training academies will be established within clusters \wards\towns\ fraternals to **stage training clinics** and to prepare life-skills coaches.

7.2 Implementation

These academies will **implement** the Ubabalo eAfrica and Global Community Games **programmes**.

8. PLAN OF ACTION: OUTREACH INITIATIVES

The plan is to **accommodate** the **needs** and **abilities** of all the **local committees** to the **maximum**. To succeed with this objective SASCOL EAST CAPE presents a **menu of outreach initiatives / programmes** so that local committees can decide on the implementation of their own ULTIMATE GOAL project. The guidelines of SASCOL EAST CAPE for each of the components will assure easy implementation and also parity within the region. The activity menu for local communities is the following.

8.1 PROJECTS

- 8.1.1 **Prayer Networks** within the local community and congregations
- 8.1.2 Street Evangelism through staged shows and **kids games**
- 8.1.3 **Big Screen** and Video presentations of World Cup games
- 8.1.4 **Festivals** and Creative performance events at schools and in congregations
- 8.1.5 **Breakfasts / lunches / dinners** at sport clubs or other local venues to promote THE ULTIMATE GOAL in their own community
- 8.1.6 Implementation of **social responsibility** by visiting old age homes, orphanages, hospitals, police stations and prisons.

8.2 PROGRAMMES

- 8.2.1 To support the training of **Life-skills coaches** by using Ubabalo eAfrica and Global Community game material and processes
- 8.2.2 To conduct **Sport clinics** and Camps to better sports-skills and to teach positive values-driven life-skills values
- 8.2.3 To organize Sports competitions to promote **community involvement** and to underline the importance of positive values-driven life-skills.

8.3 COMMUNICATION

- 8.3.1 The **distribution** of provided **literature** and the direct recommendation of applicable Christian Books.
- 8.3.2 The **promotion** of the local ULTIMATE GOAL **project** in the local media network, the congregational Sunday announcements and publications and during Sports-themed church services.

8.4 HOSPITALITY CENTRES

- 8.4.1 To support **local tourism facilities** by organising local Hospitality and Visitors' Centres.
- 8.4.2 To provide **Volunteers** to serve at the soccer games and the reception of spectators\visitors.

Note: Before embarking on any initiatives please ascertain whether there are any existing structures. Prevent the duplication of structures and concentrate on the joining of forces in order to add more value to the existing ones.

9. PLAN OF ACTION: SASCOL EAST CAPE EXECUTIVE.

The insight into the plan of action of the SASCOL EAST CAPE EXECUTIVE will lead the ULTIMATE GOAL local committees to a **better understanding** of the **processes** which guided the executive committee. This plan of action entails the following:

9.1. OUTREACH TO ALL CHRISTIAN CHURCHES

This outreach aims to involve all Christian Churches within the East Cape Province and entails the following:

- 9.1.1 to **inform** them about the ULTIMATE GOAL project
- 9.1.2 to request them to **initiate** the Ultimate GOAL project within their own church structures and congregations on behalf of SASCOL EC.
- 9.1.3 to ask for their full **support**:
 - 1) in **organising** of a local ULTIMATE GOAL **Committee** within their own Communities by **joining** the project and by **recruiting** the needed **representatives** and **volunteers** from their own churches.
 - 2) in the **establishment** of a **Prayer Network** within the local church and the community to pray for the ULTIMATE GOAL project.
 - 3) in the division of churches and schools into the existing clusters\wards\fraternals and to **work** thereafter **within** the **established structures** whenever and wherever possible.
 - 4) in **identification** of **HUB churches** and **HUB schools** within their own community
- 9.1.4 To **facilitate** the organising of '**Training Academies**' and to **utilise** the **life–skills coaches** and **training programmes** within their own congregation and community

9.2 STRATEGIC OUTLINE (IMPLEMENTATION PLAN)

The strategic outline focuses on the following:

- 9.2.1 The **guiding of local committees** within cities, towns, townships and rural areas to establish a structured organisation to implement the Ultimate Goal project and its programme.
- 9.2.2 The **developing** of such **committees** within existing municipal wards/clusters.
- 9.2.3 The organising or utilising of a **ministers' fraternal** within the local community.
- 9.2.4 The **identification** and utilization of a **Hub church** to serve as the main points of organised gatherings and a

distribution facility to the surrounding churches and congregations.

- 9.2.5 The identification and **utilisation** of a **Hub high school** to lead and support all the surrounding high and primary schools in the implementation of the ULTIMATE GOAL project and its local programmes.
- 9.2.6 The **involvement of all** churches, ward councillors, sports bodies, Non Governmental Organisations (NGO's) and Government Organisations (GO's) and businesses within their own communities.
- 9.2.7 The organising of a local committee by identifying and **appointing people** from all the mentioned local bodies who will be **available, accountable and committed** to the objectives, strategies and implementation of the ULTIMATE GOAL **project and programmes** within their own communities.

9.3 EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

To assure effective communication SASCOL EAST CAPE will make

- 9.3.1. extensive use of **technology** (e-mails, sms's, faxes)
- 9.3.2. the **existing** communication **networks** in churches, schools and all the East Cape communities
- 9.3.3. organised **visits** (subject to available funding) to the following 7 Eastern Cape Provincial Districts:

- 9.5.1 The formation of devoted **Prayer Networks**
- 9.5.2 **Marketing and Communication** of THE ULTIMATE GOAL initiative
- 9.5.3 The **Training** of UBUBALO eAFRICA coaches and GCG co-ordinators
- 9.5.4 The organising of effective **local committees** by facilitators.

9.6 SASCOL: EAST CAPE MANAGEMENT

9.6.2 LOCAL COMMUNITY COMMITTEES

- 9.6.2.1 The SASCOL: EAST CAPE Executive committee will approach a local DRC pastor in each cluster\city\town to invite another pastor to become a co-chairperson to facilitate the organizing of a local THE ULTIMATE GOAL committee.
- 9.6.2.2 The local committees should have representatives from all the congregations in the local cluster\ward\town or fraternal. There should also be enough members from the local community to manage THE ULTIMATE GOAL project sufficiently according to the given guidelines.
- 9.6.2.3 The forming of the following sub-committees might be needed.

Prayer – to organize all the mentioned prayer activities.

Contact/Recruitment- to encourage all schools and churches to participate in the local project.
Media\Communication\Public Relations – to promote the TUG project in terms of the agreed marketing guidelines.
Programs\Projects – To plan, facilitate and maintain local programs and projects.
Social\Community responsibility- to identify and to meet local social needs like Crime, HIV\Aids, Family disorders.
Training – to support the Ubabalo e Africa and Global Community Games training clinics and the trained life-skill coaches.
Hospitality\Visitor centers – to support local tourism and to welcome visitors
Street evangelism – to mount the largest evangelistic campaign ever seen in South Africa
Finance – to find enough funding for the East Cape and local project.
Local support – to facilitate and provide support and the needed encouragement to all participants in rural areas and the local township\’s.
Administration\Secretarial – to maintain a database, records and information for the East Cape website.

9.6.2.4 Some local committees may decide to incorporate all these functions and committees into a single structure.
